Greetings from Riverside,

We are excited about the things God is doing here at Riverside and we are looking for a Christ-centered staff that is committed to the Lord's service for Summer 2020. If you would like more information about what it looks like to work at camp, or to apply online, we encourage you to visit our summer employment page on our website (www.riversidelbc.org) or call us with any questions you may have.

Enclosed is a junior cabin leader application form for you to complete and return to us. In order to be considered for the position of junior cabin leader, the applicant must be a current junior or senior in high school.

Please fill out the application accurately and honestly and return it to us when it is complete. Be sure to list your three references, as well as their contact information, before you send in your application. These references should be individuals that can give a complete evaluation of who you are. (Some good references would be a pastor, youth director, past employer, an adult friend of the family, etc. At least 1 of your references needs to be someone of the opposite sex.)

The deadline we have set for junior cabin leader applications is February 1. This means that your application needs to be postmarked by February 1, in order to be sure that we consider you for employment. It is our goal to finish interviews by the middle of February, and you will hear from us by mid March in regards to the selection process. Applications we receive that are postmarked after February 1 will not be guaranteed consideration for employment, but may still be able to be hired based on need.

As a junior cabin leader, **you would arrive for staff training on May 31**. Let us know if your school schedule conflicts with training, because we may be able to hire you, even if you have to miss part of training due to school still being in session. As a junior cabin leader, you would be earning a weekly stipend of \$50 plus room and board. You are also invited to be a camper at high school week for free, as an additional part of your compensation. The junior cabin leader schedule is 7 weeks during the summer, plus a full week of training (May 31-June 5). We only require you to work 5 weeks of the summer, but you are welcome and encouraged to serve for more. The last day of camp is August 7.

Be sure to indicate any special skills or interests you have that are helpful for us as we consider your application. If you have any specific questions about anything regarding the junior cabin leader program, feel free to contact Bailey Comegys. Please join us in praying for God's wisdom throughout this time of interviews and hiring. Thank you for your interest! We look forward to hearing from you.

## About Riverside

Riverside is located just a few miles north of Story City, IA. The camp has 123 acres along the beautiful shores of the Skunk River—but don't let the name fool you! We are full of the love of Christ here! Camp housing includes cabins and retreat facilities. Riverside offers three main types of camps onsite.



The Traditional Camp Experience: Campers stay in cabins with two cabin leaders and participate in everything on the main camp site. This means chapel, Bible studies, big group games, quiet time, free time, outdoor and indoor rec activities, meals together, campfire, and a lot more.



Ranch Camp: Our ranch camp program is a top notch, high quality, Christ centered camping experience which offers campers the unique opportunity to learn more about Christ. Campers ride horses everyday, while also participating in the main camp activities.

Adventure Camp: The Riverside adventure program encompasses all it means to appreciate God's beautiful creation through adventure! We offer experiences for Juniors, Intermediate, and High adventure campers.

Depending on the age group, adventure offers experiences in team work, challenge course, high ropes, zip lining, camping, canoeing, hiking, rock climbing, and more. Adventure is an awesome opportunity for learning about Christ and His creation!

#### What can I look forward to as a junior cabin leader?

Our desire is that junior cabin leaders would first and foremost walk away from the summer knowing more of our Father's heart, our Savior's life, and our Spirit's power. WE WANT YOU TO KNOW MORE ABOUT CHRIST! That is our number one goal. Our number two goal is that junior cabin leaders would be better equipped and able to share the love and heart of God with others. With that in mind, this is a program designed to help you grow in Christian leadership. There will be specific time set aside every week for junior cabin leaders to come together and meet with camp leadership staff for discipleship, guidance, study, and relationship building. There will also be times for every junior cabin leader to meet one-on-one with leadership staff several times throughout the summer for discipling, guidance, prayer, sharing, and evaluation.



#### What do we do each week?

Along with discipleship and leadership training times, junior cabin leaders will spend a portion of their weeks at Riverside in cabins with campers and a cabin leader. During these weeks "on program," junior cabin leaders will help out with program events such as chapel, campfire, skits, pool, camp store, and art fun duties. Junior cabin leaders are not expected to assume the role of a cabin leader with the responsibility of teaching and disciplining the youth. During "program" weeks, junior cabin leaders are expected to be with the youth in their cabin groups at all times, unless time has been designated otherwise by the leadership staff. Junior cabin leaders are also expected to be good role models, by being appropriate in all things, at all times, while following ALL camp rules.

During non-program weeks, junior cabin leaders spend time at camp on "support" staff. Support staff weeks are spent primarily working on maintenance or kitchen roles. Junior cabin leaders work together with the cabin leader staff rotating through these positions. During support weeks all junior cabin leaders are expected to stay at camp and be involved in the programming each evening. Let us know if you have questions about what it means to be a junior counselor.

Working at Riverside is a great chance to be part of a Christian community where we spend our summer striving "to know Jesus Christ and to make Christ known to all." It is why we exist and why people keep coming back. Would you like to join us in God's work this summer?
